Recycling & House Hold Solid Waste

Recyclables should be put out for collection on Thursday Curbside or can be brought to the Transfer Station Tuesday and Thursday from 7am to 10am, and Saturday from 8am to 3pm. The Single Stream Recycling program allows residents to put all recyclables in one container together.

Acceptable recyclables are:

- Newspaper (including inserts)
- Magazines
- White and Manila Envelopes
- Junk Mail
- Office Paper
- Posters
- School Paper
- Fax Paper
- White and Colored Paper
- Gift wrap
- Soft Cover Books
- Hard Cover Books (with covers removed)
- Telephone Books
- Brown Paper Bags
- Chipboard (i.e. cereal, pasta, and shoe boxes, etc.)
- Corrugated Cardboard
- Egg Cartons
- Metal Cans (aluminum, steel, tin)
- Metal Containers (pie plates, trays, foil)
- Plastic Bottles and Containers (#1 through #7)
- Glass Bottles and Jars (any color)
- Aseptic Containers (milk and juice cartons and juice boxes)

House Hold Solid Waste

- Household Garbage
- Food Waste
- Styrofoam (even if there's a recyclable symbol on it)
- Foam Packing
- Plastic Bags (even if there's a recyclable symbol, most stores will take their plastic bags back for recycling)
- Glassware (drinking glasses, window glass, mirrors, incandescent bulbs)
- Ceramics (Pyrex)
- Tissues and paper towels
- Disposable diapers
