Dear Mr. Mulholland:

Funds for the Suncook Area Center are primarily generated from three main sources. The sources for the operation of the Center are funded by local tax dollars in conjunction with funding from the Electric Assistance Program (Utility Companies) and the Low Income Energy Assistance Program (Federal). The Center is the local service delivery network for Agency programs in your community. The local support of our Center is vital for us to continue intake and referral, outreach and contact with residents of your community.

The attached budget reflects the minimum costs of maintaining the Center. We will continue to work closely with your welfare officer to ensure the maximum availability of resources from our programs, as well as continue to mobilize any resources other than local tax dollars that become available to help serve residents of your community.

Included is a brief description of Agency programs accessed by Allenstown residents through the Center. This includes the number of residents served and the dollar amount of assistance provided by the Center staff. As always, we will be available to answer any questions that you may have.

For the past six years, in recognition of the economic downturn and the resulting financial burden of the communities the Center serves, the Agency has not asked for any increases in funding from the local communities for the Center. However, due to decreases from State and Federal funding sources, we have had to reevaluate the Center budget and must now ask the communities to increase their level of support for the operations of the Center.

Therefore, on behalf of the Suncook Area Center and the \$301,644.00 worth of service dollars provided to residents of the Town of Allenstown utilizing Federal, State and local funds, we respectfully request consideration of our services and submit the following recommendation to the Budget Committee: "To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$20,000.00 for the continuation of services to the low income residents of Allenstown through the Suncook Area Center of the Community Action Program Belknap-Merrimack Counties, Inc."
