







## **Probabilistic Snowfall Forecast**











## **Snow Starting & Ending Times**

Note: Heaviest snow ends by 8 am Wednesday all areas. Ongoing snow showers will persist in the mountains and foothills Wednesday.













### Maximum Wind Gust Tuesday through Tuesday night



#### **Impacts and Timing:**

- ✓ Tuesday afternoon and Tuesday night
- ✓ Blowing/Drifting Snow with near blizzard conditions along and inland from the coast.
- ✓ Downed branches may lead to power outages

#### What to Expect:

✓ Building nearshore waves will allow for beach erosion, splash-over and possibly minor coastal flooding around the time of high tide Tuesday









## **Event Summary**

# Major Winter Storm likely Tuesday- Wednesday. Blizzard conditions possible

- ✓ Confidence is HIGH that this event will occur and MODERATE HIGH on expected impacts
- ✓ Period of greatest impact: Tuesday afternoon/Tuesday night



The potential exists for 12 to 18 inches of snow



Very strong northeast winds may cause possible blizzard conditions



Storm force gusts over the outer waters with some splashover and coastal erosion possible
