	To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$11,500,000 (gross budget) for the purpose of financing the costs of engineering and construction of the New Clarifiers at the Allenstown Wastewater Treatment Facility and to authorize the issuance of not more than \$11,500,000 of bonds or notes in accordance with the provisions of the Municipal Finance Act (RSA 33) and to authorize the Selectboard to apply for, obtain and accept federal, state or other aid, if any, which may be available for said project and to comply with all laws applicable to said project; to authorize the Selectboard to apply for a Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) loan; a USDA/Rural Development Loan; and to authorize the Selectboard to issue, negotiate, sell and deliver said bonds and notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon and the maturity and other terms thereof; and to authorize the Selectboard to take any other action or to pass any other vote relative thereto. Without impairing the general obligation nature of the bonds or notes, it is intended that repayment of the bonds or notes, including any CWSRF loan or USDA/Rural Development loan, shall be paid by sewer funds.
